



Mackillop Education: Student Code of Conduct

We at MacKillop Education, want you to have success at school!

It can take some time to practice **HOW** to have success at school. We are all learning what our best strategies are that can help us manage our anger, anxiety, sadness, and even friendships. And this takes time. And that is okay.

We support all of our students learning how to manage their behaviours in a positive way whilst believing that **EVERY** MacKillop student and staff member also deserves to feel safe at school.

So, if there is a time, when you have repeatedly demonstrated a **MEDIUM OR HIGH** level behavior, OR you have been involved in a **CRITICAL** incident, then you will be asked to go home. This is best for your own safety and others.

This is what the process can look like (see right):

If there is a **CRITICAL** incident we will have a meeting with you and your guardians so that we can all support you to feel safe at school. Sometimes that this may mean that we can come up with a plan to help you.

If we are worried about your safety the next day we will organize an **individual session** with your teacher before returning to class. This will give us time to hear what you need and come up with a plan.

MEDIUM LEVEL BEHAVIOUR

Some examples of medium, high and critical level behaviours are:

Medium	High Level	Critical Level
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Teasing/name calling *Refusing to use Safety Plan *Inappropriate language to staff or other students *Peer conflicts that require intervention but have minimal impact on others safety 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Student is aggressive or threatening *Refusing to follow any instructions *Carrying a weapon *Bullying *Using/supplying alcohol/drugs at school 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Immediate safety of student or others in compromised *Physical assault *Destruction of property *Aggressive threats of personal harm
